SESSION 1

THE PEOPLE'S CHOICE

February 4

All the President's Men

"The Washington Post" reporters Bob Woodward and Carl Bernstein uncover the details of the Watergate scandal that leads to President Richard Nixon's resignation.

February 18

Life is Beautiful

When an open-minded Jewish librarian and his son become victims of the Holocaust, he uses a perfect mixture of will, humor, and imagination to protect his son from the dangers around their camp.

March 3

One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest

A criminal pleads insanity and is admitted to a mental institution, where he rebels against the oppressive nurse and rallies up the scared patients.

March 17

High Noon

A town Marshal, despite the disagreements of his newlywed bride and the townspeople around him, must face a gang of deadly killers alone at high noon when the gang leader, an outlaw he sent up years ago, arrives on the noon train.

March 31

The Color Purple

A black Southern woman struggles to find her identity after suffering abuse from her father and others over four decades.

April 14

Rear Window

A wheelchair-bound photographer spies on his neighbors from his apartment window and becomes convinced one of them has committed murder.

April 28

Notorious

A woman is asked to spy on a group of Nazi friends in South America. How far will she have to go to ingratiate herself with them?

May 12

Walkabout

Two city-bred siblings are stranded in the Australian Outback, where they learn to survive with the aid of an Aboriginal boy on his "walkabout": a ritual separation from his tribe.

May 26

The Last Wave

A Sydney lawyer defends five Aboriginal Persons in a ritualized taboo murder and in the process learns disturbing things about himself and premonitions.

June 9

The Tracker

When a Native Australian man is accused of murdering a white woman, three white men (The Fanatic, The Follower and The Veteran) are given the mission of capturing him with the help of the The Tracker.

June 23

Rabbit-Proof Fence

In 1931, three half-white, half-Aboriginal girls escape after being plucked from their houses to be trained as domestic staff, and set off on a journey across the Outback.

July 7

Ten Canoes

A fusion of Yolngu and Western tales, set in Arnhem Land 120 years ago, *Ten Canoes* combines adventure, comedy, and anthropology to explore an Aborigine folk tale both fallibly human and legendary.

Gulpilil: One Red Blood

A portrait of Gulpilil.

August 4

Best Years of Our Lives

Three World War II veterans return home to small-town America to discover that they and their families have been irreparably changed.

August 18

A Tree Grows in Brooklyn

Encouraged by her idealistic if luckless father, a bright and imaginative young woman comes of age in a Brooklyn tenement during the early 1900s.

September 1

Bringing Up Baby

While trying to secure a \$1 million donation for his museum, a befuddled paleontologist is pursued by a flighty and often irritating heiress and her pet leopard, Baby.

September 15

How Green Was My Valley

At the turn of the century in a Welsh mining village, the Morgans, he stern, she gentle, raise coal-mining sons and hope their youngest will find a better life.

September 29

The Good Earth

Although married Chinese farmers Wang and O-Lan initially experience success, their lives are complicated by declining fortunes and lean times, as well as the arrival of the beautiful young Lotus.

October 13

Goodbye Mr. Chips

An aged teacher and former headmaster of a boarding school recalls his career and his personal life over the decades.

October 27

The Thin Man

Former detective Nick Charles and his wealthy wife Nora investigate a murder case, mostly for the fun of it.

November 10

The Lady Vanishes

While travelling in continental Europe, a rich young playgirl realizes that an elderly lady seems to have disappeared from the train.
